Start of Day Procedures

Please note that there is no supervision before school.

- The school day starts at 8:25am when class registers will be taken. (Classrooms open at 8.20am)
- Children arriving at school after 8.35am need to go to the Primary office to be registered before going to class.



Timings of the school day

- School starts at 8.25am
- Morning Break at 10.00am
- Lessons Resume at 10.20am
- Lunch Break 12.15pm
 - Children eat their packed lunch in classrooms or in the school canteen if they have school dinners, for 15 minutes before going out to play. (EY1 and 2 children will get 30 minutes to eat their lunches from 12.00pm)
 - Lunchtime ECAs run from 12.30 until 1.00pm
- Lessons Resume at 1.00pm
- School finishes at 3.10pm



End of Day Procedures

- School finishes at 3.10pm
 - Please ensure that your children are collected from school by a known adult.
 - If playdates are arranged in EY1 and EY2, please let the class teacher know your child will be collected by a different adult.
- We prefer that children in Years 4 to 6 are collected from school by an adult, however if you wish your child to walk home unaccompanied, please complete a consent form before you leave today.

Please note that there is no supervision for children on the school playgrounds after 3.15pm. All children on the school grounds after 3.15pm must be accompanied by an adult, and all families are expected to vacate the school grounds by 4.30pm.




At DBIS Primary we offer an *irresistible* curriculum

Our DBIS Curriculum identifies an ambitious body of knowledge and the skills we believe are required to equip our students to operate in a sophisticated, global, technological world, taught through an enquiry based approach to support the development of critical thinking and problem solving skills in our learners.

Our international setting and focus means that our students develop a global outlook and are tolerant and curious about those whose culture is different from their own.

The DBIS Curriculum

- We offer an engaging and stimulating DBIS Primary Curriculum in all areas.
- There is transparency in terms of what students are learning and when.
- We use a Standards based assessment programme for reporting attainment and progress based on mastery rather than acceleration.





How we learn at DBIS

The way your child learns may be quite different to how you learnt at school! At Discovery Bay International School we make sure our teachers keep up to date with the latest developments in teaching and learning...this is what your child may tell you about their learning:





Partner'. We share our ideas; plan our work; and reflect on our learning together. This helps us both. My learning partner might be different in Maths, English and Enquiry. We change partners regularly and they are randomly chosen.



In lessons we decide on

Success Criteria. This helps
me know how I can be successful
in my learning and how to make my
work even better.





We are encouraged to apply learning attitudes like being resilient; finding links and connections; adapting to change; being curious; and applying creativity to solve problems. Practicing these will help us to be lifelong learners.





Learning can happen inside and **outside the classroom**. Sometimes I might go to different parts of the school to learn, or even to the **beach** or the **plaza**!

We also go on **educational visits** throughout the year.







I know that it's OK if I make a mistake in my work. If I got everything right, that would probably mean the work was too easy for me anyway!



I do my learning in different ways.

Sometimes I learn independently, sometimes with my talk partner, sometimes in groups with other children and sometimes in groups with the teacher or Educational Assistant. All of these are good ways to learn.







In Years 1 and 2 we often learn through **play** and **exploration**, and can choose whether to be inside or outside. The way we learn keeps us **engaged** and makes us want to **grow our brains** even more!



In most lessons the teacher uses the **interactive**whiteboard to support our learning. Other technology is used to support and record our learning, including cameras, iPads and chromebooks.





My teacher will often use **lolly sticks** to randomly select someone to share their ideas.







My teacher doesn't mark every piece of work in my book - sometimes I have to evaluate how well I have done using the **success criteria**, or my **talk partner** will help me decide what I can improve.

I know exactly what I am learning about, or learning how to do because we have **Learning Objectives**.







I can show what I have learnt in different ways. Sometimes I will have work in my book but there are other ways to show what I have learnt, these include: work on a mini-whiteboard; discussion in small groups; activities on a laptop or iPad; presenting to my teacher or the class; games or activities with my talk partner; or work in our class topic book.
