- School finishes at 3:10pm




Snacks and Lunches

- We encourage children to bring healthy lunches and use as little single use plastic as possible





Our Curriculum

An overview of what the children will be learning in Term 1 will be sent out via the parent portal.

Reading

We ask that the children read <u>Monday to Thursday</u> for a minimum of 15 minutes. <u>Levelled class readers will be sent out on Monday</u> for the children to read at home. On other days children can read a book of their choice from home or the school library. <u>Each read should be entered into your child's diary</u> and we encourage the children to write this themselves. Please note that when we refer to a 'read', we are referring to a <u>15 minute block of reading time</u>. This could be from the same book like when your child is reading a chapter book or when they read for an extended period of time. Diaries will be checked and iReads will be updated every morning.

In Year 3 we are very aware that many of the children are strong technical readers who need their comprehension skills further developed before moving onto a higher reading level. If you are concerned about the level of books that your child is bringing home then please do not hesitate to come and see us. For more information on how to help at home please see the following slide.



Guided Reading Questions: Level 3

What strategies would you use when you get stuck on a word?

What voice might the character use? Where does the story take place?

Who is telling the story and how do you know? Find some words or phrases which tell you about the setting.

What happened in the story?

How did the characters' actions affect the outcome of the story?

What is the theme of this story/text/ article? Why has the author chosen that title? Does the layout and colour of the text have an impact on the reader?

How does the author engage the reader? Why do you think authors use short sentences?

Which part of the story best describes the setting?

When would you use a glossary?

What did you enjoy about the story? Can you think of another story with a similar theme? What is the genre of the story? How do you know? What was the most exciting or interesting part? Explain why.

What effect does the setting have on the story? Have you read any other books in the series/by the same author?



Where and when is the text/story set? How does the writer show this? Have you read any other books that are about the same topic?



Maths

On Monday 1-3 activities will be set on Mangahigh or Times Tables Rockstars. This is to be completed by the end of the week. The website and password for these sites will be sent home in the children's diaries. We will go through how to log on in class so they will be confident in logging on at home.



Spelling

On Monday 1-3 activities will be set on Spelling Shed. This is to be completed by the end of the week. The website and password for this site will be sent home in the children's diaries. We will go through how to log on in class so they will be confident in logging on at home.



Discovery

Your child will also have optional homework associated with their current discovery unit. This will usually be an open ended task that will run over a few weeks or the whole unit. Children will be able to choose which task and how many tasks they want to complete over the course of the unit. Please check Google Classroom for task details.

Uniform

DBIS has a compulsory school uniform. Information regarding uniform can be found on the school's website. Some key points to remember:

- School shoes: all children must wear plain black or dark blue school shoes
- All students must have a hat for outdoor PE and playtime. We have a 'no hat, no play' policy
- Jewellery: watches and small stud earrings are permitted (but must be covered or removed for PE), no other jewellery is permitted to be worn to school
- Make-up, nail varnish and temporary tattoos are not permitted to be worn to school. Hair dye is only permitted if of a natural colour
- Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back
- During colder months please ensure you purchase a school uniform jumper for your child to wear
- PE Kit:
 - Children in Years 1 3 can wear their PE kit all day on PE days.
 - Children in Years 4 6 can wear PE kit to school if their lesson is before lunch (and then change at lunch), if their lesson is after lunch, they should change into PE kit at lunchtime.

Pencil cases: please ensure these can fit in the children's trays



Drop Offs and Pick Ups

Year 3 students should be accompanied by an adult to and from school and should be supervised until the bell goes in the morning and from 3:10 in the afternoons. Students should not be on the campus before 8:15 unless they have an ECA in the morning. If your child is not going to be picked up by an adult on any particular day you need to inform your child's class teacher.

As you can imagine the Year 3 balcony can become extremely congested at certain times of the day. To help ease this, we kindly ask that from the week commencing Monday 19th of August, that parents and helpers refrain from coming upstairs at the start and end of each day. Of course if you need to have a quick chat with your child's teacher you are most welcome. As well as making the balcony safer for all students we hope it will help to develop a sense of independence. Children can be dropped off and met in the covered area by the sand pit.
